VI. High School Principal's Report

- Math department beginning to request math curriculum to review for purchase for next year - Go Math; Simple Solutions, and Illustrative Math samples requested so far. Looking to PaTTAN for recommendations.
- Educational Talent Search (ETS) visited to work with 7th and 8th graders on study skills.
- ETS visit planned for the end of January to work on interviewing techniques with our Juniors prior to their presentation/interviews in February.
- 7th & 8th Grade students worked on career exploration, with Mrs. Rupp, and completed career artifacts in their English classes.
- ASVAB interpretation training, for our Juniors who took the assessment, was held in December.
- Mental Health Job Shadowing Zoom Experience planned for January 11th.
 Students who signed up for this experience will participate in the Clarion County Human Service Meeting. Agencies will be identified and individuals will explain their career and what this involves. Students will have the opportunity to ask questions and engage. Students will also be expected to interview our SAP liaison and Mrs. Buckley, our therapist from SPERO.
- The National Honor Society will hold a Cancer Awareness week for the student body at the end of January.
- Stop the Bleed training scheduled staff in January
- Dr. Fillman from RIU6 will be working with staff on curriculum writing using the UbD template.

VII. Superintendent's Report

- The Homeless Review binders are finished and are being converted to electronic format for our impending audit
- Our grant has been approved through the ARP Homeless Children and Youth Allocation - reduced to \$13,444 to put toward the purchase of a school van to replace the old blue van
- The High School PA System has failed again. The problem has been isolated to a single room which is likely causing the problem. Since the speaker was changed, the only other issue we can think of is a bare wire which will be replaced.
- Policies many new policies to approve which are mandated. We are to provide yearly notification of these policies
- Budgets staff are currently developing their budgets
- Health and Safety Plan only revision is to allow the district to follow the mandates/guidance of either the DOH or CDC rather than just the DOH
