Flexible Instructional Days



What is a Flexible Instructional Day?

A Flexible Instructional Day (FID) is a day designed for students to continue to learn while at home on a day that may not be safe for students to come to school for instruction due to inclement weather or other school closures. Using a FID allows for the calendar to remain the same without the need for make-up days.

Flexible Instructional Days (FIDs) will be used only in cases of extenuating circumstances that do not make it safe for students to travel. Union High School values in-person learning and will make every effort to instruct students in person.

How will parents be notified?

- A School Messenger phone call will notify parents if a FID will be used. Media outlets will be notified and the information will be posted on the District Facebook page and District Website.

What happens on a Flexible Instructional Day?

- All teaching and learning will occur virtually.
- Homeroom attendance will be taken in 1st period using Google Meet from your Classroom link. Students must have their camera and microphone on for attendance/roll call.
- Remaining class periods' attendance will be determined by the individual classroom teacher. Some teachers may require you to log in for class, complete an assignment, or both.
- All after-school activities are cancelled when a FID occurs.



Student Responsibilities

- If USD anticipates a FID, students will take their Chromebook, charger, and all other materials needed for classes home when instructed to do so.
- Students that do not have access to internet at their homes should procure a hot spot from the main office or tech department if a FID is anticipated.

Daily Schedule

- Classes will be held at the regular times using either the 2-hour delay bell schedule or the normal bell schedule.

Lunch



- FIDs are used in extreme weather or unexpected situations therefore school meals will not be available.

Absences

- Excuses for absences will follow the same protocol as an in-person learning day. If a student is unable to log in to a remote class, it's the student's responsibility to email the teacher that they are having technical difficulties, during the time that the class is scheduled. Failure to email the teacher during the scheduled class time will result in the student being marked absent.
- Students may be assessed half a day of absence if they did not attend all required classes.
