### V. Elementary Principal's Report

- Federal Program update/report:
- Mrs. Greenawalt and I attended the Jefferson Clarion Head Start, Inc Community Partnership Breakfast June 22, 2023.
  - 43% of students in the program have a verified disability (speech language, developmental delay, autism). National average is 18%. Clarion and Jeffferson are significantly above the national average.
    - Head Start center 6 out of the 16 students had a verified disability (37.5%). Average attendance was 65%.

- Pre-K counts average attendance was 89%. 6 out of the 15 students have a verified disability (40%)
- 2. Decreasing enrollment from 18 students to 15. Due to student behaviors.
- 3. Eliminating transportation from home to centers. Anticipate this may impact the number of students being served.
- STAR SWPBIS additions: Title IV funds
